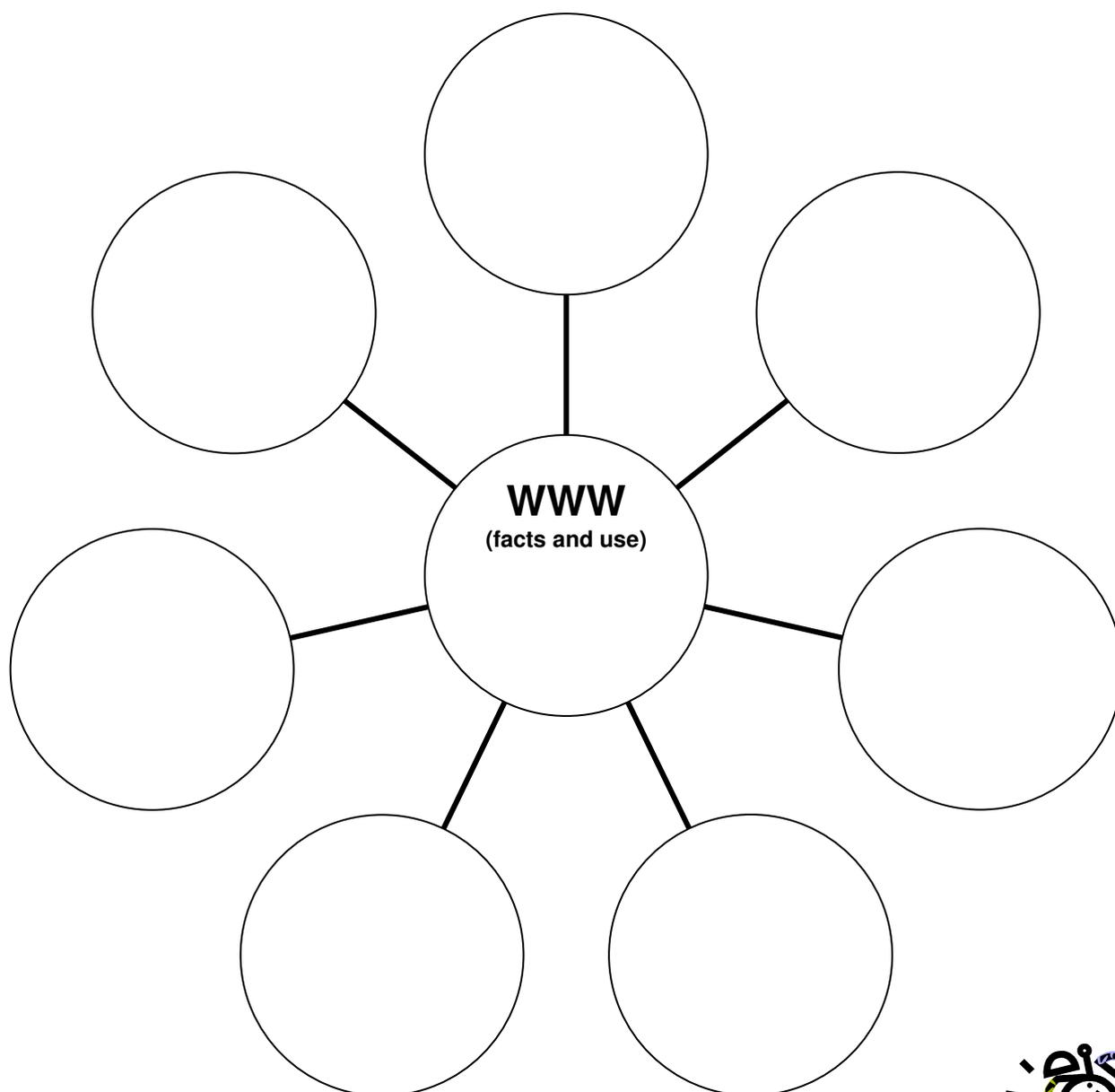

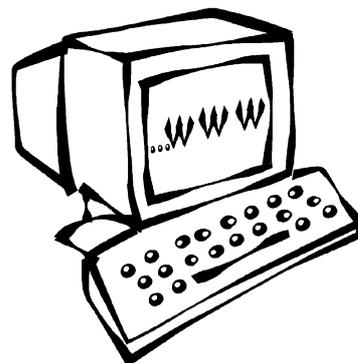
**Post-listening:**
